

PLIPDECO sends two more on leave

THE Point Lisas Industrial Port Development Corporation Ltd (PLIPDECO) has placed two more staff members on administrative leave.

They are vice president of business services Nigel Subiah and corporate secretary Richelle Lyman.

Their leave took effect on January 29 and will end on March 15.

In a notice of material change posted on the T& T Stock Exchange (TTSE) yesterday, PLIPDECO stated that, effective January 30, Deera Goorahoo- Ramdeo, manager of finance, assumed the role of acting vice-president of Business Services until March 15.

Kelly Jackson-Baynes, legal manager, assumed the position of assistant secretary until March 15.

This comes after both the substantive and acting presidents of PLIPDECO were placed on administrative leave, within a span of six months.

On July 29, 2024, PLIPDECO president Ernest Ashley Taylor was placed on leave, and Dr Averne Pantin, the vice-president of Technical Services, was appointed to act in the position.

Taylor retired from PLIPDECO on December 1, 2024, with the organisation stating that Pantin would continue to act as president until further notice.

However, PLIPDECO filed a material change notice with the TTSE, stating that Pantin was placed on administrative leave. Effective January 20, Curtis Dennie, vice president of port operations, assumed the role of acting president until further notice.

Public company PLIPDECO's two core activities are industrial estate management and port operations.

PLIPDECO is the owner and landlord of the 862.613-hectare Point Lisas Industrial Estate, located on the west coast of Central Trinidad.
